This year, we are redoubling our efforts, growing the number of camp locations to 46 across Ontario with a projected 8,800+ campers this 2017 season. Although we've come a long way, a recent survey of parents revealed that while 72.2% have a high awareness of what STEM means, only 14.4% say they are very familiar with the STEM educational approach. Further, only 30% of our campers are girls.

As we transition from the information age to the innovation age, our nation will need more STEM brains.

And we want to make that happen.
